- a) On 4/1/2 Tpr. was dispatched to a complaint of loose horses in the area of the and and Road in Tpr. interviewed from Mrs. tated that five horses have been running loose throughout the neighborhood since 3/28/2 and that she believed that the horses were owned by Tpr. further stated that an interview of was conducted at the property. Mr stated that he was out of town for a few days and the horses had gotten out. Mr howed Tpr his barn and horse stalls and the following observations were made: General condition of the shelter was poor, ther were no bails of hay and only a small quantity of hay in the feeders. The barn was extremely filthy and although there were three grain barrels in the barn, there was little or no grain in them. There were six horses on the property. On two of the horses, the ribcages were plainly visible. Mr stated to Tpr. that he just obtained those horses and hasn't had time to build them up. The statement of Tpr. is attached hereto and made a part thereof.

s has owned horses for 36 years and is a former employee of the MSPCA in for several years and in the past, he had invited her to stop by and seethe horses. On 4/1/ went to barn and Mr was not home. Ms stated that she went into the unlocked barn and looked at the horses. Two of the horses were so thin that you could count their ribs and Ms stated that she knows that Mr these horses several months ago from urchased Four of the other horses which were present of C lost about 400 pounds since she last saw them in February, 1993. The horses are so weak that they can barely stand. There feet are badly overgrown. There was no hay, grain or water in any of the stalls or in the barn. The horse manure was up to ber knees. The statement of is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

I therefore, request that the court issue a search warrant directing the search of the property of specifically, the barn or any out building or area where animals would be confined to seize the following property and evidence: Horses, carcasses, animal food, animal excretement. And that this warrant be directed to any member of the New York State Police and any officer or employee of the Animal Shelter.
